

"We saw the images on TV, but the reality (of the damage) was even worse," said Don Aheron, General Manager, Nationwide Homes.

Nationwide Homes and LGS Home Builders got to work. "LGS reached out to us, asking how we could help," Don said. "Many builders wanted to assist, but they were having a problem sourcing supplies and logistics. That was something we could definitely help with." Nationwide Homes donated high-quality materials like flooring, cabinets and vinyl siding. LEGISLATIVE UPDATE



North Carolina General Assembly

The NCGA reconvened on November 19th with the primary focus on a second Hurricane Helene relief package. However, the session included much more than just disaster relief. The NCGA passed several constitutional amendment referendums and overrode the governor's veto of a bill requiring local Sheriff's departments to cooperate with Federal Immigration Enforcement Agencies. The relief package, Senate Bill 382, contained much more sweeping legislation than just hurricane relief. It contained over 100 pages to make changes in the structure of state government.

Here are some of the highlights:

- The legislation would have the State Auditor, not the Governor, choose the members of the State
 Board of Elections which could be comprised of three members of one political party and two
 members of the other. The auditor would also select the chairs of each of the county boards.
- Various changes to the election laws (to help speed up the process of dealing with ballots)
- Tightening control over legislative appointments
- Legislative takeover of the entire Halifax Street Mall parking deck
- Reduce the Governor's appointment power over vacancies in the judiciary
- Limit the power of the Attorney General
- Abolish the Courts Commission
- Make the State Highway Patrol an independent department, with the Commander subject to General Assembly confirmation
- Allow the Treasurer an appointment to the Utilities Commission by eliminating an appointment from the Governor
- Repeal the Energy Policy Council and reallocate power to the Utilities Commission
- Allow OSFM to make uniform rules for temporary placement of Manufactured and Modular Homes in the disaster areas.
- Various energy emergency program changes
- Swine Waste Resource Credits
- Changes around multiple employer welfare arrangements
- Changes around the Commerce Major Events, Games, and Attractions Fund
- Making the schools for the blind and deaf independent state agencies
- Creating two new cooperative innovative high schools
- Various public education changes
- Move the Center for Safer Schools to the State Bureau of Investigation
- Repeal the Task Force for Safer Schools
- Various higher education changes
- Changes in local government downzoning



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE - CONTINUED

The temporary rules for manufactured and modular home placement would allow the OFSM to make uniform rules for the placement of our homes. This is for temporary placement only and would expire in March 2025. Here is the provision:

AUTHORIZE THE OFFICE OF THE STATE FIRE MARSHAL TO PROMULGATE RULES FOR TEM-PORARY MANUFACTURED AND MODULAR DWELLINGS SECTION 1F.4.(a) Notwithstanding G.S. 143-139.1, G.S. 160D-911, or any other law to the contrary, the Office of the State Fire Marshal may adopt rules, and prepare guidance for local governments enforcing the North Carolina State Building Code and the State of North Carolina Regulations for Manufactured Homes, that relate to the placement, construction, installation, and connection of temporary manufactured and modular dwellings. Approval of temporary manufactured and modular dwellings shall be evidenced by labels or seals acceptable to the Office of the State Fire Marshal. All temporary manufactured and modular dwellings bearing labels or seals shall be deemed to meet the requirements of the North Carolina State Building Code, except as may be required for the enforcement of the Code relative to utility service connections to temporary manufactured and modular dwellings and enforcement of local ordinances governing zoning, utility service connections, and foundation permits. The Office of the State Fire Marshal may also adopt rules to ensure that any person that places, constructs, installs, and connects a temporary manufactured and modular dwelling meets the manufacturer's installation instructions and applicable provisions of the North Carolina State Building Code and the State of North Carolina Regulations for Manufactured Homes. For the purposes of this section, a "temporary manufactured and modular dwelling" is a manufactured housing unit that is designed for utilization as a temporary dwelling in the affected area. SECTION 1F.4.(b) Rulemaking. – The Office of the State Fire Marshal shall adopt emergency rules to implement the provisions of this section. SECTION 1F.4.(c) Expiration. – This section expires on March 1, 2025

The Bill passed the General Assembly and was VETOED by the Governor. The General Assembly later reconvened and voted to override the Governors VETO and the bill is now law.

NC Office State Fire Marshall- Manufactured Housing Board

During the last MHB meeting in October, OFSM presented a draft Bylaws for the Board consideration. The staff indicated that the need for adoption was to comply with legislation asking all Board and Commission established by the NCGA to provide a copy of the Bylaws, membership, and minutes to the Legislative Library before the end of the year. NCMHA spoke against the need to create Bylaws since the operation of the Board was already spelled out in legislation that created the Board. And that the Board only needed to respond to the Legislative Library that they don't have Bylaws and there is no need to create them since it was already state law. The Board decided that they should adopt Bylaws and met in early December to finalize their Bylaws. NCMHA has communicated with OFSM on suggested language and recommendations.

Scott Turner Nominated as HUD Secretary

President-elect Trump announced Scott Turner as his pick for Secretary of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

"We are thrilled about the nomination of Scott Turner as HUD Secretary," said MHI CEO Dr. Lesli Gooch. "We appreciated his engagement and attention to innovative housing solutions in his previous role at the White House during President Trump's first term. We look forward to working with him again to elevate innovative housing and expand attainable homeownership."

Turner visited three manufactured homes on the National Mall in 2019 and complimented MHI and the manufactured housing industry for its innovation and creativity. Scott Turner served as the inaugural Executive Director of the White House Opportunity and Revitalization Council (WHORC) during President-elect Trump's first term. Collaborating with former HUD Secretary Ben Carson, Scott oversaw 16 Federal Agencies in implementing over 200 policy measure to advance economic development.

Following his NFL football career, Turner transitioned into politics and won a State House race in his home state of Texas. He is now the CEO of his family's foundation, Community Engagement & Opportunity Council (COC), which aims to rejuvenate communities across the country through initiatives centered around sports, mentorship, and economic empowerment.


FHFA Releases New Manufactured House Price Index:

Manufactured Homes Appreciated Nearly 8% Year-Over
Year While Site-Built Homes Increased 6%

Today the Federal Housing Finance Agency (FHFA) released its new Manufactured House Price Index. The Index is based on data from real-property conventional mortgages acquired by Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac. Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac are Government Sponsored Enterprises (GSEs). GSE loans are land-home. The majority of manufactured homes are purchased as home-only. According to Home Mortgage Disclosure Act data, land-home loans accounted for less than 14% of manufactured home loans in 2023. These were the key findings from the Manufactured House Price Index:

- The quarterly index found that manufactured home sale prices (purchase only) increased 7.9% from Q2 2023 to Q2 2024. In comparison, the FHFA's core House Price Index (HPI), which measures home prices for site-built homes, increased 5.7% during that same period.
- For all transactions, manufactured homes with conventional mortgages acquired by Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac appreciated 6.9% over the past four quarters while sitebuilt home prices increased 5.9%.
- The median price of manufactured homes purchased with a real-property conventional mortgage issued through one of the GSEs, such as Fannie Mae or Freddie Mac, was \$231,000 in Q2 2024. The majority of manufactured homes are purchased as home-only. GSE loans are land-home. According to Home Mortgage Disclosure Act data, these loans accounted for less than 14% of manufactured home loans in 2023.

"FHFA's new data resource on manufactured homes provides relevant, up-to-date information on an important but less-understood segment of the housing market," said FHFA Director Sandra L. Thompson in the agency's press release. "In a housing market with elevated home prices, manufactured housing remains an affordable option. This new data should help advance discussions on responsible efforts to expand homeownership opportunities."
